## Mission of HPA:

HPA is a pre-professional advising office for pre-health (pre-med, pre-dentistry, pre-optometry, pre-PA, pre-pharmacy, pre-PT, pre-OT, pre-Chiro, pre-AT, etc.) students and MSU alumni. HPA works with students of any major who are preparing for a health profession.

## Academic Advising VS. HPA

## Academic Advising:

- Discuss degree requirements and courses needed
- Create semester schedule and get help with enrollment
- Give Student Advisor Reg PIN
- Resource to help you succeed academically (Tutoring, mentoring, MSU services)

### Pre-Professional Advising with HPA:

- Discuss courses needed for graduate schools (Prereqs for application) and how those fit into your degree
- Timing of taking those pre-reqs and which ones you need prior to entrance exams
- Entrance Exam preparation and timing
- 4-year plan with courses, volunteering, shadowing, and other experiences to prepare for applications (and help finding those experiences)
- Application preparation and help

- Sociology (SOCI 101S)
- College Writing (WRIT 101 OR HONR 201US)

- Please note that some graduate programs do NOT accept AP or IB credits. They DO accept dual enrollment credits.
- If your AP credits are in Chemistry, Physics, or Stats-please chat with a HPA advisor.

## Why use HPA?

- Save \$30,000 over the course of 4 years compared to private pre-professional advising services.
- Acceptance rates are between 40-60% higher compared to students who don't use HPA.
- On average, 80% of students who use HPA are accepted into graduate programs for medicine, dentistry, PT, OT, Podiatry, Pharmacy, PA, etc.
