Congress 2024

Pre-Congress and State Ambassador Officer Selection will be Sunday July 7-9, 2024. Congress is July 9th-12th.

Montana 4-H invites all members 4-H age 13 and older, volunteers, and MSU Extension faculty and staff to the 2024 Montana 4-H Congress event on the Bozeman campus of Montana State University.

Montana 4-H Congress provides youth from across the state an opportunity to come together on the Montana State University campus in Bozeman for four days and participate in an event like no other. Congress offers both youth and adults a venue in which to learn, be challenged, and most of all, have a great time with their peers. Montana 4-H'ers have been attending an event like Congress for decades. Congress has become an important tradition and is the signature event for the Montana 4-H Program.

Congress' purpose is to provide a safe and fun environment for youth to experience all that 4-H Congress has to offer including contests, workshops, entertainment, social events, and much more.

Youth must be at least 13 years old as of October 1 of the current 4-H year. Chaperones must be certified 4-H Volunteers or MSU Extension staff who are at least 21 years of age.

To access the registration for this event, log in to your ZSuite account and click on events in the left menu. If you are eligible to attend this event then it will appear in your events. Registration Deadline is June 15.

Registration for 4-H Congress is \$230 (2023) and includes lodging (Tuesday-Friday), meals (Tuesday Dinner - Thursday Dinner) and program costs. Parking on campus is an additional cost and will be billed if selected.

Food Safety Training

Update about the food safety certification for the food booth this summer:

Attached to the newsletter email is the master Food safety. Leaders have also received a copy of this list. If your name is in the "Needs Food Safety" column, then you will need to complete it this year.

We currently do not have an FCS Agent to put on a Food Safety Class and will not have one certified in time to perform an in-person training. You will need to complete this online training; screen shot or take a picture of the completed training and then email in or drop off the picture along with a list of those who participated. The email attached to the training is no longer active and so we will not be able to see who has completed the training at this point that way.

Fair Time Camping Spots at the Central Montana Fairgrounds

It is that time of year where you should start thinking about if you would like to get a camping spot reserved out that the fairgrounds. These spots start to fill up fast once the weather gets nice out. I spoke to the fairgrounds, and they only have dry spots open. These are filling up also, if you need a spot, you should contact the fairgrounds ASAP.

To reserve a spot, you need to go out to the Fairground Office and fill out a form there. There is not an online form or link to reserve online.

Showmanship Classes

A common mistake is entering the wrong age group for animal showmanship classes. You enter by your 4-H Agehow old you were on October 1, 2022, not your current age.

Showmanship is required for anyone selling a market animal.





Schultz takes third in MFBF Speech Contest

The annual Montana Farm Burau Foundation youth speech contest was held April 4 in conjunction with the Montana State FFA convention at the Billings Metra. Eleven 7th, 8th, and 9th grade 4-H and FFA members from across the state competed for cash prizes with first place paying out \$400.

Johnnie Schultz, a Winnett Shamrocks 4-H member, placed third in the contest with his prepared speech on the given topic, "Agriculture or Tourism? Which is really Montana's cash crop? What does the Montana agriculture industry need to do to remain competitive and sustainable?"



Students were asked to think about three points while researching for their speech which was to be between 2.5 and 5 minutes long. How can we work with the tourism industry to ensure a future for both? What does the future look like for each of these industries and consider the economic impact of each industry in the state.

"One of the Montana Farm Bureau Foundation's priority goals is to support agricultural education and leadership development of Montana's youth," said MFB Director of Foundation Development Alena Standley. "Some of Montana's brightest young leaders have competed in this contest and it's exciting to offer cash prizes to this group."

Contest results and awards were given out at the MFB Foundation booth in the State FFA convention trade show where FFA members and advisors could gather to grab snacks and drinks, take some down time in a comfy chair or try their hand at ax throwing.

The winner of the 2024 MFB Youth speech contest was Naomi Cass, Billings FFA with Eli Huckeby, Missoula FFA taking second, and Schultz, Winnett Shamrock 4-H, third.

Fourth place went to Chelisa Stone, Geraldine FFA with Justin Aye, Broadus FFA, placing fifth.

Each winner went home with a check from the MFB foundation with first place paying out \$400, 2nd place \$300, third place \$200, fourth place \$100 and fifth place \$50.

Serving as judges for the contest were Cyndi Johnson, a Conrad farmer and President of Montana Farm Bureau Federation (MFBF). MFBF Vice President Gary Heibertshausen an Alzada sheep rancher and Kris Descheemaeker, District three MFBF director and rancher from Lewistown.

Show ring savvy pays off for Denton teen

This was Caitlyn Poser's third year competing at \the Western Regional Junior Angus Show, and, perhaps proving the saying "the third time's the charm," she ended up in the showmanship winner's circle, taking fifth place.



"In showmanship you are judged on how well you show the animal," Poser told the News-Argus. "This was intermediate showmanship, and we started with about 75 people competing. In the final drive it was narrowed down to about 20, and then I took fifth."

This was not an easy class to ribbon in, Poser explained.

"Not only is the level of competition really high, but where a final drive usually lasts about 20 minutes, we were in the ring for nearly 50 minutes. It's the longest I've been in a final drive," she said.

Because winning anything at that level is so much more difficult, Poser said she was thrilled with her fifth place finish.

But that's not all — Poser also showed her heifer, Prada, in both Junior and Open classes. Prada placed third in the Junior class and second in the Open class.

"Taking second meant I also got to show in the division class. I didn't think we'd get anything there, as the two heifers that won champion and reserve were really nice. My heifer isn't at her best yet, as I want her there when we show at NILE," Poser said, adding she was excited just to be in the championship ring.

The 2024 Western Regional Junior Angus Show was held in Reno, Nevada, April 11-13. Poser flew to the show and back, arriving home on Sunday, April 14 and then heading off to school on the 15th.

"I was really tired that Monday," she said.


