- **Ambassadors:** Traveling Farm is April 1st we will be meeting at the bowling alley at 9 am with or without an animal. - **Livestock Committee:** Livestock Committee will be looking for youth to help pour the new pad needed for the scale in May. When the concrete being donated for sidewalks in front of the 4-H Food Booth and small animal barn is poured, extra concrete is being donated for a new scale pad. At the next meeting, the Livestock Committee will be discussing the prizes they wish to purchase for the 2024 Central Montana Fair Youth Livestock Show.
- **Small Animal Committee:** We have set up our showmanship clinic for June 3rd at 5:30 at the small animal barn. The Berger and Gallagher family put together 2 bird netting forms to help with covering the pens. We have started to have rabbit and poultry practices. Please watch your email for more dates and dog practice dates coming in April.
- **Horse Committee:** The Horse Committee is working to get spring clinics and clinicians lined up. Fair judges are also lined up for 2024. The "Top Hand Award" has been changed to the "True Grit Award" and the criteria has been modified accordingly.
- Static Committee: We have sent out the template and instructions for the sticker contest. Currently, we have not received any designs. The due date for the designs is May 1st. We have been receiving the intent to sell forms for the indoor auction (Due May 1st) and I have tentatively secured Ken as the auctioneer. - Food booth: The door is a go for some time in May, but looking at a different style than the quote, due to fairgrounds request. It has been brought forth to add a sliding door (barn door style) to the front so that the roll up door fits in with the décor at the fairgrounds. The fairgrounds if working on upgrading some of the food booth, new LED lighting, larger fan in the back and a new breaker box. We have acquired a microwave; we will see if we need a smaller one still. The food booth will also be getting a new pad in front of the building (this will extend also to the small animal barn), allowing ease of wheelchair and walker access. This funding has been donated by a generous donor and they would like 4H kids and parents to help with the forming and raking when it is time.
- Workbook Committee: We have been communicating I am hoping to have a meeting here in the next couple of weeks.
- **Awards:** The medallions are in the process of being ordered and they will cost \$2.00 + .10 = \$2:10 We will be buying 200 of them. All other rosettes are fully stocked, and we will be using them till we are out.
