Communication Days

It is that time of year to start thinking about what you want to do for Communication Days

Several options are available for you to choose from to participate in and use your communication skills! Those include Demonstration, Illustrated Talk, Prepared Speech, Impromptu Speech, Video, Commercial, Career Communication, or Promotional Package.

Six of the above options will be contest opportunities at State-H Congress for members 13 and older who score high at the county level. Those six are Demonstrations, Prepared Speech, Illustrated talk, Video, Career Communication and Stir-Ups.

Which one will YOU do?

Though we haven't yet celebrated the New Year, 4-H Communication Days are just around the corner! It is time to begin thinking about it, because *early preparation is very wise!* Early prep may allow you more practice time, possibly in front of your 4-H club and/or family. This is a great opportunity for experienced members to present for the new members, thus allowing the new members to get a better idea of how to do a presentation.

Demonstration DVD & Other Resources Available

For some, doing demonstrations can be an intimidating and confusing process. If you fit in this category, consider checking out a DVD showing six Sanders County finalists in previous years. It can be helpful to watch examples as you begin to put your topic together. Contact the Extension Office if you would like to check out this DVD to view at home or a club meeting. Stir-Up Contest

Participants will compete individually or in teams of two. Contestants prepare a dish utilizing five of the nine listed ingredients. Additionally, contestants may use pantry ingredients and spices. They must use at least one mystery ingredient and can use up to three. The dish should be visually appealing, nutritious and show creativity. Contestants should use effective work habits and sanitary food preparation practices. Following the preparation of the meal the contestant will present an oral presentation to judges. The oral presentation should address; selection of dish; preparation process; nutritional value of dish; potential alteration and overall learning. For a complete contest description, contact the Extension Office.

Favorite Food Show

Participants in the Favorite Food Show will gain experience in planning, preparing, serving and presenting a nutritious food as part of a meal or snack. A display including correct table setting, recipe and menu posters, a centerpiece and decorations will accompany the participants chosen Favorite Food. Any 4-H member, including Cloverbuds can participate. Members may enter as an individual or a two-person team. Categories include appetizer, bread, salad, main dish, sandwich, fruit or vegetable side dish. All food categories will compete against one another. For a complete list of contest description, contact the Extension Office. This is not a State 4-H Congress contest option.

Pick the Day you will do your Communication Presentation. Choose from two dates!

Members who participate in Communication Days will receive \$45 scholarship to go towards the cost of Multi-County Camp!!

<u>Day 1</u> is scheduled for *Saturday, March 1* in Thompson Falls beginning at 10:00 am.

Day 2 is scheduled for Sunday, March 2 in Hot Springs beginning at 1:00 pm.

If you find it impossible to participate on either of the dates offered contact the Extension Office. If a judge is available to view your presentation on an alternate date arrangements will be made to accommodate you so you may complete your presentation prior to finals day. Top presenters from these two events will qualify to participate on **Finals Communication Day, Sunday, March 9th in Plains**. During these events anyone is welcome and encouraged to watch the presentations being given by members. A full scholarship to 4-H camp will be awarded to the top four presenters in the Junior Division if they are 12 years old or younger, juniors who are 13 years old and place in the top four will be awarded a trip to State 4-H Congress in Bozeman to compete in the state communication event.

Treasurer's Report: No Report

Old Business:

Fair Improvements:

- Ryan and Bethany are working on the Jason Hanna sign.
- Raelyn & Carissa will look at the gates/lattice that need repaired in the sheep barn.
- Doug/Whitney hope to do some updates in the Rabbit/Poultry Barn. (Plywood walls, roof, new poultry pen supplies)
- New tin on swine barn. Taylor Construction bid \$11,000 to replace roofing and rotten boards underneath, rotten post and facing board. John Thurston bid \$10,250. Mahlon Lee bid approx. \$18,000 not to include any board replacement. Dallas Bender bid \$7500 plus \$10/8' length boards needed. Fair board might want to use old tin on the Pavilion walls. Juli has requested grant funds for this project from AgWest.
- The fair board has aluminum bleachers above the grand stands we could use at the show arena. They would like to use the ones we have as well. The new ones would need railing installed. Juli is getting a price on the railing. Juli will check with Kristy to see if using the bleachers from the fair board is still an option.
- Outlet by announcer/clerk area in livestock arena.
- Upgrade electrical in camping area. Juli will check with Kristy to see what is there now.
- Fill in stalls needed in steer barn.
- Upgrade swine barn plumbing.
- More sand/level livestock show arena.
- Paint swine/sheep barn.
- Mats/sand under tie rail.
- Put in lower tie rail in beef wash rack area.
- New hot water heater in showers? Maybe just serviced? Fair board is looking into this.

Awards - Reviewed sponsors and expenses. Decided on colors for awards.

New Business:

Sale/Report Review - Reviewed fair reports. Great sale!

Meat Raffle Report - \$15,090 was raised. 25% of proceeds go to the Livestock committee (\$3,773). Pay Council for *Superintendent Meals* – 17 meal plans for \$935. Tara motioned to pay; Carmen seconded. Motion passed.

Livestock Policy - discussed possible changes. See attached draft.

Fair Review - Deep dive into schedule. Finalize by spring.

2024 Judges – keep same judges as last year with exception of livestock judge. Discussed who to ask for 2025

Treasurer's Report shows a good bank balance due to unplanned donations/refunds this year. Budget Proposal 2024-2025 was prepared by the budget committee prior to the meeting. Some missing numbers will be added and council will discuss and vote electronically.

Reports

- 4-H Dining Hall name may be changed in the spring.
- Awards donations were close to expenditures for popular member choice format.

Belt buckles from 4-H mall were lost and have been re-ordered. Council will consider changes in the spring.

- National 4-H Week club activities included work on the 4-H logo on the "H" hill in Hot Springs by the Wranglers, and window painting by the Mountaineers in Thompson Falls.
- Achievement Day included almost 200 people. Suggestions to reduce the program length were no potluck or just desserts, announce club awards at the club meetings, and work on labeling the awards more clearly.

- Ambassadors' recent dance training was a success and fun. Jaden and Melodie Cook reported on Fall
 Leadership training in Billings. Melodie said it was the best she has attended and her favorite workshop was
 on "how to dress".
- Clubs' year plans & club officer lists & civil rights letters are due.
- Yearend financial reports/club dues are also due; three clubs have paid dues so far.
- Sledding Party at Naegeli Ranch will be in January. Brooke will talk to Sarah N. for dates
