Why should you choose US 101US- First Year Seminar as your US Core?

US 101US focuses on the transition to college. **For Native students,** this means learning from each other's unique perspectives that may highlight cultural backgrounds/heritages and participating in discussion in which Indigenous practices, beliefs, and current issues are key themes.

• How is the class organized?

- o Unit 1- Build a toolbox to navigate the expectations of your classes and get the most out of your time at MSU
- o Unit 2- Think about and discuss topics at the college level
 - Topics related to social justice, including MMIWG/P
- Unit 3- Students pick their own social justice topic, research it, and present their work
 - Learn how to research and explore a topic that is important or impactful to you
- Unit 4- Students reflect on what they have learned during the semester
